



## MAINTENANCE TIPS

For whom the chain squeaks -- so you've figured the chain could use some oil, so far, so good. Be sure to execute step two--wipe the chain off after oiling as the oil only attracts grit and creates more damaging friction--the situation you want to escape in the first place.

Get the most out of the new higher pressure (105psi and up) tires by investing in a high quality floor pump, and frequently top off the air in those low rolling resistance wonders. Save your frame pump for flats on the road. High pressures mean those new tires will naturally lose air faster than older gum-walls.

# Quitting Bicycling

I know, you're probably like me. You've tried to quit bicycling but you couldn't do it. You know you should. You have good intentions. You're concerned about your family life (or lack thereof). You tried. You've no doubt asked yourself, "What went wrong?" Well, I can tell you. Bicycling is a lot like dieting. Basically, the same rules apply. Have you ever known someone who was bent on losing weight? Just try to remember: how did they go about it? Did they just quit eating all of the good things, cold turkey? No more cream pies? No more chocolate malts? And then, after a few days, they went on an eating binge and gained about fifty pounds? I'll bet that's what happened.

Well, the same thing happens to bicyclists who try to quit pedalling. I know from personal experience, and examples are all around us. Lon Haldeman? Sure, he tries to quit bicycling-all of the time. But with what success? As you know, he isn't obeying his body's biorhythms. He denies them. And with what result? Binge city, that's what! That's why he rides clear across the continent. Just like the dieter who falls off the wagon and eats everything in sight, the bicyclist who tries to quit gets a compulsion to ride every road in sight. He just can't ride enough. That's the real explanation for ultra-marathon riding. We marathonists really don't want to ride. We don't like to ride. We want to quit. But we can't. We just keep falling off the wagon because we're going about it all wrong.

So, what's the solution? It's simple. Indulge yourself. Go ahead: ride around the block when you get the urge. Go to the store. Ride downtown. Don't repress it: ride a little, give in to your body's demands. Obey those biorhythms! And think about the alternative if you fall off the wagon. Do you really want to ride from California to New York in ten days?

## Bicycle Maladies

I was struck one day by the simultaneous occurrence of a broke spoke, wheel squeal, and derailleur failure. Was there rhyme or reason for this? Was it poetic justice?

A careful analysis has revealed that something strange is going on, perhaps due to a bilaterally symmetrical creature operating a two-wheel deal. At any rate, one who rides is in for double trouble.

It starts with all those funny little noises our machines are subject to—usually a hint of something more to come. In addition to the aforementioned wheel squeal, there is link clink, crank clank, rack clack, bottom bracket racket, and the more disturbing cone groan. Sometimes a simple application of a lubricant will end these problems, but beware of over-application which may result in grease release.

Some ills are mostly cosmetic. Among these are bag sag, bar tar, light blight, water bottle mottle, grim rim, and tool kit grit.

The serious difficulties include such things as bad pad, pump slump, lame frame, sew-up blow up, queer gear, the automotive look-alike fender bender, and most serious of all, the dreaded tire fire.


## RACE REPORT


