Tips for Winter Cycling

Bike Equipment:

The goals are:

- S better traction
- s resist punctures from cinders
- keep all the slop off of your bike and you
- § be seen in the inclement weather
- For better traction, use larger tires with a coarser tread.
- To resist cinders, use:
 >tires with kevlar belts, although this only slows the cinders down
 >tires with thick treads
 >tire liners or thick inner tubes
- To keep the crud off of you and out of your chain, the best solution is fenders.
- To be seen, a rear led taillight is cheap and effective. A modest headlight improves visibility to the front.

Clothing:

General principles:

dress in layers

- bottom layers should be made of material that wicks moisture well.
 Poly-pro and wool are good candidates.
- the front of the top layers should block wind. This is true for jackets and tights, and even gloves.
- the rear of the top layers should breath, to avoid build-up of moisture
- clothing should have adjustable vents or zippers that can be adjusted to avoid overheating while riding. Try to avoid sweating!
- dress so that you start out just a bit chilled. If you are comfortably warm when standing still, you'll be too hot when riding.
- Never wear cotton! It will absorb moisture and make you cold.

There are some clothing items somewhat unique to biking that are essential for cold weather: balaclava, booties, clear/ yellow/pink lenses for the sunglasses.

News from the League of Illinois Bicyclists

State Legislation / Boub Update

November's elections brought many new faces to Springfield, where we will again seek a resolution to the liability problems established by the 1998 Boub v. Wayne Illinois Supreme Court ruling. The liability disincentive resulting from that case has severely hampered efforts throughout the state to establish on-road bike facilities and signed routes. Together with the Chicagoland Bicycle Federation and others, LIB will continue to strive for a legislative solution.

Illinois' legislature generally focuses on budgetary issues in even-number vears and all other topics in oddnumber years. At this writing, we are lining up our primary sponsors of a bill to be introduced in the 2003 session. Legislator surveys and informational brochures were sent earlier this year, with many positive responses from potential co-sponsors. Some discussions have taken place with local governmental groups and others interested in liability issues. Also, we have led the way in making this a priority issue in the state's Conservation Congress process.

In 2001, our bills made a strong showing, thanks in huge part to all our members, bike clubs, bike shops, and others who contacted their state representatives and senators. We'll again be relying on you, presenting you with simple opportunities to help remove this policy "black eye" that is unique to Illinois. Much of the action on our bill will take place between March and May, so keep an eye on our website (www.bikelib.org) and look for action alerts during that time.

Federal Transportation Bill Update

With elections over, the next Congressional session will soon open. With it will come debates over reauthorization of the TEA-21 federal transportation bill, which has been helpful to bicyclists.

The US House, the Senate, and the Bush Administration (Federal Highway Administration) will each submit versions of a new bill. Early signs indicate that transportation funding, presently at \$32 Billion/year, could hold steady or decrease – despite calls for higher funding from virtually every group involved in transportation. The result will be fiercer competition for funds, including the 1% that now goes to bicycling improvements.

Some activity will take place in the next quarter, so look for occasional action alerts on our website (www.bikelib.org). You can also join the national America Bikes coalition and sign up for updates at www.americabikes.org

PEORIA – LIB Executive Director Ed Barsotti attended the Balanced Growth Workshop held by IDOT in Peoria on September 17. The attendees included decision-makers on transportation issues at the state and local levels. A handout on bicycle issues (on-line at www.bikelib.org/political_state/balanc ed_growth_conf_2002.html) was distributed.

LA SALLE - LaSalle County is starting the process of putting together a countywide trail and greenway plan. An organizational meeting was held in LaSalle on November 21, with 30 people in attendance. The purpose of this and other early meetings is to prepare for a grant application from the Illinois Department of Natural Resources to fund the plan.
