PREZ SEZ:

As members of the Illinois Valley Wheelm'n, we get a bargain for the cost of membership. Currently, the fees are \$10 for individual and \$12 for a family. The IVW board has had discussions of raising those rates to \$12 and \$15 respectively and I still see it as a bargain. One of the reasons for increasing the membership fees is that we've

incurred more costs lately. For a long time, the newsletter was printed at no cost to the club. Since April we now have to pay for the printing. Another cost we incurred in October is for a storage rental. The IVW has equipment stored at various members' homes and it has become a burden for some to move several crates and boxes around just to get to their own household goods. That's asking too much of any member, so the board has decided to rent a storage site that'll cost around \$400 per year starting last month. Additionally, our only fund raising event is the "No Baloney Ride." We've had inclement weather last year and the threat of inclement weather this year. The exact figures aren't in yet for this year, but it looks like we made a slight profit of around \$900, but we took a loss the year prior.

Even if the rate goes up to \$12 per year for individual (\$1 per mo) membership with IVW is still a bargain. There is an organized ride available weekly somewhere within driving distance. During the middle of the summer, I counted 15 different organized/ride leader events per week. Some summer days we have 3 rides in a day. For instance, back on Thursday, August 17, there was an IVW ride in Pekin, one in Washington and one in Peoria.

Additionally, your membership includes a monthly newsletter that informs the members of our club rides as well as local club rides and other long-distance biking events.

Then there are the club socials that allow you the opportunity to get with friends that share the same interests. We had socials at Apples Bakery in January; German American Society in March; breakout rides in Washington & Metamora in the spring; campout rides in Kewanee in May; poker/spaghetti ride in August; Tanner's Orchard Ride in October; etc...

Then we had informational/educational type club meetings/ programs during the year: January's program was about the Tri-Peoria club, February was Antique Bikes plus a bike maintenance class at Bushwhackers; March was "Tour de France;" April was "Biking Across America;" May was a swap meet; and this month we had a program on "Competitive Cycling."

Additionally, your club dollars help sponsor bike-related programs and charities such as: Bikes for Kids, League of Illinois Bicyclists, the new Peoria Riverfront Museum (for bike racks); and other related charities.

So please vote "yes" to increase the dues by \$2 per year for individual and \$3 per year for family at this month's annual meeting. The money is a good investment for you and the biking community.

ILLINOIS VALLEY WHEELM'N - November, 2006 Rides Schedule

<u>Saturday Show and Go Level III</u>: Ride meets at Washington Square at <u>8:30 a.m. all year</u>. Distance varies from 25-60 miles.

<u>Saturday Show and Go From Russell's All Levels</u>: Meet at Russell's in Washington at 8:30 a.m. Distance ranges from 25-40 miles and includes a meal stop.

<u>Sunday Show and Go Metamora Levels I and II</u>: Meet at Metamora Town Square at 1:00 p.m. Distance is 20-30 miles North route to Washburn or south route to Roanoke. Contact person is Pam Hoehne (681-0206) or pamela.schuckhoehne@sbcglobal.net

Ride Levels:

(Ride leaders can be contacted for specific details concerning their rides)

Beginner/Family: These rides are at a casual pace averaging less than 12 miles per hour and ride as a group.

<u>Level 1</u>: Rides average 12-14 miles per hour and regroup on a regular basis.

<u>Level 2</u>: Rides average 13-17 miles per hour and regroup occasionally.

<u>Level 3</u>: Rides average 17 miles per hour and over. Riders may regroup periodically but should be prepared to ride in pace lines to keep from being dropped.

Show and Go: Rides have NO leaders. The distance and speed is decided upon by the group, but governed by the ride level designated.


On the riding side, he enjoys jaunts along Grandview Drive and the Rock Island Trail on weekends or holidays. Ride Rules:

- 1. Riders must obey all Illinois Traffic Laws.
- 2. Ride no more than two abreast.
- When riding in a large group, create space to help motorists.
- 4. Use hand signals and obey all traffic signals.
- 5. Check all intersections for traffic.
- 6. Warn riders of potholes, dogs, cars, and other obstacles.
- 7. Riders are strongly encouraged to wear approved helmets.
- 8. Riders should make certain that their bikes are in good working order.
- Riders should carry water and a spare tube for their wheel size.
- 10. Riders should be prepared for weather conditions. Most rides take place in any weather.
- Riders should arrive in time to be <u>ready to ride</u> at the start time.

"Reminiscences of the History of the Illinois Valley Wheelm'n Bicycle Club by Uncle Larry Davis, Club Archivist"

I've got a tub full of old newsletters from Sam Joslin. The earliest newsletter (that I have) is from May-June 1971. It identifies the club as the "Peoria Tri-County Wheelers", Central Illinois bicyclists from Peoria, Tazewell, and Woodford Counties. This also involved Wednesday night rides from McClure Library at 7:00 p.m. to Sheridan Village and back. Sunday morning rides from Lakeview via Big Hollow Road to Koerner Road and the new Peoria Youth Hostel. Alternate Sunday morning rides from the Peoria Courthouse Square (near the fountain) to Morton, or from Mossville Grade School thru Chillicothe and Rome. Contact names for the rides were John Bakke and Joe Mugavero. Twenty Peorians attended the New Salem/Springfield ride. Sue Garmer and her husband conceived of this event.

A statewide rally was scheduled to be held in Springfield in June in support of the Illinois Bikeway Act. A joint ride with the Bloomington Roundabouts (Indiana) was being planned for a fall ride thru the covered bridge trail. The Peoria Tri-County Wheelers were affiliated with the League of American Wheelmen and encouraged individual memberships in the L.A.W.

Looks like the club became the Illinois Valley Wheelmen (note the spelling) in 1972, and identified themselves in the newsletter as "formerly Tri-County Wheelers".

A "racing section" was having its first meeting May 2, 1974, with Terry Jones identified in the article, and a reference to Competition Cycle (a shop on West Main when I first came to town.)

That same newsletter had a couple of other groups: "Town & Country Riders" and "Le Tour Riders".

Jack Welch's new Blue Schwinn LE Tour was described, as well as the Yellow Super Sport he wanted to sell. (Ed. Note: This is the same Jack Welch, I assume, that is planning the Spain/France Bike Ride in May, 2007) Ron Anderson had a new Raleigh Super Course, and wanted to sell his old Murray 10 speed. A club membership cost \$3 single, \$5 family. Contact was to be made to Rita Fishman.

I've got the racing section stats for 1974 with names, times and points, as well as what appears to be a club roster from that year with phone numbers. Looks like 60 individuals and families. Familiar names are: Ron Anderson, Alan Harkrader, Steve Meismer, Les Siegrist, and Jack Welch The 1975 Hilly Hundred had several Wheelmen attending, including Judi and Ross Farris, Bill Perry & wife, Les, Jim, Rich, and Steve, and the article's author (John Wineke.)

February 1975's newsletter identifies officers elected in January as: President - John Wineke, Pekin; Vice-President - Jim Ellington, Pekin; Secretary - Pam Anderson (Ed Note: I would've loved being in the club at the same time as Pamela Anderson) and Treasurer - Ron Anderson, Washington. The racing group elected Steve Meismer as President and Rich Miller as Treasurer - so they could "operate independently - as will be necessary for progress."

Membership costs were reduced (!) to just \$3 for either individual or family. As for the important name change - I see the Illinois Valley Wheelm'n name first used in the April 1975 newsletter, but the membership form still used the old spelling. It appears that the revised spelling wasn't official until 1989 when the Constitution and Bylaws were proposed in the spring for a vote later that year.

As early as 1976 they were talking about the Rock Island Trail, Morton Pedal-In, Trailer, Beginner's Rides, Commuters Clinic, and Maintenance Clinics, as well as the twelve Rally Racks installed at Peoria City Hall behind the dragon that had front wheel cables already installed (lock to be provided by the user).Larry Davis
